The time has come we believe to bring to an end our ongoing regular collections for Madaba, as the refugee community there has reduced substantially, with many having found new jobs and homes. Our Parish has been involved with Madaba since 2017, initially through Parishes for Peace, but then by direct contact. Eliz and Mike Wood have been key to the success of the contact and support our Parish has made with Madaba.

The community there in Madaba has found our support exceptionally helpful, and they have sent us wonderful thanks repeatedly. We will cease our regular collections for Madaba, but want to say a very big thank you to Eliz and Mike Wood, to Dominic Schofield, and to all of you for all your kind and generous support since our Parish started this in 2017. You will no doubt be very pleased to learn that our Parish has collectively contributed over £52,000 to Madaba since we started our support in 2017. Again, a huge thank you to all our Parishioners.

Our Parish may start a similar kind of regular support for another charity, but that will be discussed and agreed at a full Parish meeting that will be held this Autumn.
