### **STOP THE LEGALISATION OF ASSISTED SUICIDE**

Catholics are urged to contact their MPs today to stop the legalisation of Assisted Suicide. On Wednesday 16 October, the House of Commons will hear the first reading of a new bill on assisted suicide tabled by Labour MP Kim Leadbeater; the timing of the bill makes it probable that MPs will have a vote on assisted suicide before Christmas this year. The Catholic Church teaches that life is a gift to be cherished and cared for from conception until natural death. While the bill may have the support of well-known figures, it is not supported by the Church's teaching which is consistent with regard to the dignity of life. ### **BEHOLD THE INHERITANCE OF THE LORD ARE CHILDREN: THE REWARD, THE FRUIT OF THE WOMB'**

Psalms 127: 3 The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales continues to be seriously concerned about the implications of the current two-child policy on Universal Credit payments for vulnerable, larger families. Introduced in 2017, the policy has been undermining the financial security of families with three or more children. Such families often have no choice but to make claims for Universal Credit as a result of common, but unpredictable, life events, such as job loss or the onset of disability. The majority of families affected by the two-child policy are working families. This is a matter of principle backed by Catholic Social Teaching.
